<p>Examination procedure description</p>	<p>The examination committee shall evaluate the candidate based on the following:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a) Relevance and impact of their scientific performance; b) Their ability to coordinate students and young researchers; c) Their teaching expertise in relation to the position requirements; d) Their ability to impart knowledge and to disseminate the results of their respective scientific portfolio; e) Their ability to collaborate effectively and efficiently with peers in scientific endeavors, according to their respective field of expertise; f) Previous work experience in higher education institutions. <p>The examination will consist in an academic/scientific lecture, held before the examination committee. The examination committee will decide upon the topic of the lecture 48 hours prior to the established date and time for delivering it and publish it on www.animv.eu.</p>
